A great deal of change has and continues to occur, leaving survey responses in a middle of the road direction, verses one way or the other.
Budget reduction is negatively impacting everyone on campus and tension is being to build between the various units and colleges. At the same time everyone is committed to serving students.
Faculty and staff are not involved in the decision making process of department placement. When a department is moved, staff are told they will be moving and have to arrange for the placement of materials after the fact. No clear reason nor courtesy given to the staff.
I would like to see more professional development - designed to support effective practices for ALL students - basic skills through advanced. I would like to see classrooms better designed for project based collaborative learning and multi media and white board use
In spite of all of the drawbacks, the quality of the Instructional Prog. is very high. Mission is top heavy in Admin. Needs to be streamlined.
Increasing communication and improving access would greatly improve the college.
It is too early to judge the new Chancellor.
need more updated computer labs for instructional use- especially design, editing, video production
Shared governance sometimes seems to polarize factions within the college more than it brings them together. Committee work takes too long to acheive results. In a climate where decisions need to be made within a short timeline there does not appear to be a fast track approach that can be used to reach a goal quickly.
some of the statements above have multiple parts to them and some parts i strongly agreed with but other parts that i do not agree with so it was hard to select from the scale.
The Mission College community has worked very hard to implement integrated planning and evaluation in all its programs and services. It has been hard work coupled with budget and personnel cuts. People are working harder with less, and yet they keep at what they are doing because they are dedicated to the mission of the college and to the college itself. I think that is quite admirable and inspirational.
The staff of the colleges are woefully under-represented and undervalued .
Those questions related to finances at the institution were rated neutral mainly because very little money is moving through the system due to systematic cut backs on the state level and district stresses. This is not a negative for the college but the painful realities of our current economic situation.

Within the student body, there is a lower academic level that continues to struggle and fail within Basic Skills despite all efforts put forth by the College. Doing more of the same thing expecting a different outcome is crazy. It is obvious that for this particular segment of the population something different needs to be presented to them and it does not seem to be happening.
